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1. Opening

LK gives a report on the development on golf in Europe. The presentation is attached.

Number of registered golfers is stabilizing in Europe after many years of growth. Statistics show big differences in number of rounds per golf course. This is something the EGCOA will start monitoring on a more regular basis.

Key Issues for the various national owners associations:

BVGA Germany

Get the star-system international together with hotels on the golf course, pooling the voting rights for AGM hosted by the DGV. Organise the national golf conference in March 2014.

8 new courses were opened in the last two years.

NVG Holland

Retention of new and existing golfers, education in pricing, education on danger in working with third parties. 2 courses opened in 2013.

FPG Denmark

One big issue: growing the game of golf, for this the creation of development



programmes. 1 course opened.

SGCOA Spain

Key is the reorganisation of existing golf courses combined with getting more foreign players. Create connection with Latin America. 7 courses were closed in 2013.

FNG Norway

Member creation and retention: finding new membership models and grow the game, focus on more efficiency in operations and cooperation of golf courses: profit and loss and membership exit-strategies. Close look at VAT-regulation for golf courses. 2 courses opened and 5 closed in the past 2 years.

SGKY Finland

Change from member-golfer to nomad: reinforce memberships, 3rd parties, low greenfee prices. Focus on increasing service for members and players. 4 courses opened in Finland.

GEGF France

VAT, real estate tax, constructive relationship with the Federation, social issues and training are key focus points for France. 2 courses opened and 3 closed.

FSG Sweden

Find answer to members changing to cheap memberships, create buying group savings, tax issues and more cooperation. 1 course opened, 6 closed.

AMGH Czech Republic

Key is the creation of new golfers by upmarketing the image of golf and new player development initiative.

5 courses were opened in the last two years.
